Recreational Activities in the Area

The Fontainebleau has some room availability surrounding the conference dates at the reduced rate. Miami Beach is within driving distance of a number of tourist destinations in South Florida. Conference attendees can choose from a number of recreational activities, some of which are listed here:

The following beaches/destinations are also in driving distance of Miami Beach

- Key Largo, Key West and the Florida Keys (1 to 3 ½ hours South)
- Palm Beach (~1 ½ hours North)
- Disney World (3 hours 45 mins Northwest)
- Bermuda and the Bahamas are also a reasonable plane or boat ride away
- Sanibel and Captiva Island (3 ½ hours West)
- Airboat rides on the Everglades (e.g., the "Gator Boys" from Animal Planet; <http://www.evergladesholidaypark.com>)
- A number of Cruise ships dock in Miami Beach

Opportunities for fishing, snorkeling, parasailing, waterskiing, scuba diving, and boat riding on the Atlantic Ocean and the intercoastal waterway are also available.
